# MIN NCG-MNCF/06/22/02/2024/02 INTRODUCTION OF MEMBERS

The members present introduced themselves stating the various groups they represent. There was representation from the Narok chamber of commerce, Narok Town Bus Terminus, Muthurwa and ODM markets in Narok Town,

The Board members followed suit stating the various associations they represent and positions they hold in the Board.

# MIN NCG- MNCF/06/22/02/2024/03 OVERVIEW OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF NAROK ONGOING PROJECTS

The Municipal Manager briefed the Forum on the various ongoing projects within the Municipality as discussed below;

a) Adoption of the Ongoing roads projects - Construction of cemented 10km road to bitumen standards using AC concrete type 1 in Narok Town area (2018/2019)

It was noted that the Municiplaity of Narok had since completed the the construction of

key roads within the Municipality approximately 10 km in total. the financial year 2018/2019 completed the construction of key roads within the Municipality approximately 10 km in total.

The roads under this projects are; Catholic-Nyawera Road- 1.1km, Cbd\_Wheatland Road - 0.2km, Garage Road - 0.35k, Lenana Road-1.25km, Lower-Lenana Road-1.4km, Majengo-Catholic Road-0.21km, Majengo-Lenana Road-1.12km, St.Peters-Nyawera Road-0.57km, Stimulas-Majengo Road-0.814km and University Road-2.8km.

# b) Approval of the proposed Narok Town Bus Terminus FY (2019/2020)

It was noted that this project had also since been completed and that transport operators and traders had since been relocated to the terminus.

# MIN NCG-MNCF/06/22/02/2022/04 PLENARY

The representatives were at this point given the opportunity to make proposals for inclusion in the Municiplaity's development policies and plans and also react to the brief on the ongoing projects/activities for action by the Board.

The reprsentatives of the various groups made the following proposals and recommendations to the Board;

- a) Establishment of a meat processing factory within the Municiplaity to create job/business opportunities for the residents of the Municipality.
- b) Establishment of a Maasai market in the Muncipality appreciating the need to create business opportunies for the residents of the Municiplaity.
- c) Creation of a recreation park within the town center as well as shades to beautify the town and also serve as areas where residents can retreat for breaks during their daily activities.
- d) Rehabilitation and development of the existing markets as well as ensuring that the markets are equiped with the relevant services such washrooms, water supply, etc.

- e) Planning of a benchmarking exercise between the market and Bus Terminus officials and other fucntional modern markets offficials in progressive municiplaities to learn the best practices on management of the institutions to ensure ordeliness.
- f) Setting aside of an office for purposes of daily operations for the officials of the Narok Town Bus Terminus.
- g) Putting in place meausures necessary to caution the persons living with disability from the harsh economic times through consideration of tax exclusion and also ensuring that accesability of amenities and services is achieved through adoption of PWD friendly construction styles and services.
- h) Consideration of the reduction/ waiving of the business levies upon the business community in Narok Town to caution them against the harsh economic reality during the ongoing pandemic.
- i) Putiing in place of measures necessary to curb disordelinees within the Municiplaity ranging from disorganised bussiness practices, grazing of cows in town, etc.
